RISK ASSESSMENT

- 1) Area – outdoor areas of the campsite
- 2) Who is at risk – Staff, customers
- 3) Potential Hazards and risk level
 - a. Slips trips and falls - Medium
 - b. Getting lost - Low
 - c. Adverse weather - Low
 - d. Vehicles - Low
 - e. Fire -Low
 - f. Theft from tent
- 4) Measures taken to control risks
 - a. Group leaders responsible for their own groups’ supervision. Outside toilet blocks well-lit at night.
 - b. Group leaders to supervise people in their own groups. Signage around the campsite. Perimeter fence. Emergency procedure for missing persons.
 - c. Group leaders responsible for their own groups’ safety out of activity sessions. In an emergency campers may use the 2 outdoor classrooms, the BBQ shelter and small 3-sided cabins on Model, D of E, Paget and Dorothy Dean. A 24/7 emergency number for the duty member of staff is advertised on the reception door.
 - d. 5mph speed limit on site. Signage to reinforce this.
 - e. Follow advice from reception in hot weather regarding the use of open fires.
 - f. Campers should not leave anything valuable in tents. Staff observe whilst out and around site. Groups should challenge anyone who doesn’t look like they should be there and report anything suspicious to reception.
